HIGH HOLY DAYS GENERAL INFORMATION

TICKETS – Due to limited space, only members will receive tickets for the High Holy Days. The back of your ticket lists all the dates and times of the services. Seating is on a “first come first served” basis. **Seats may not be saved for those who will be arriving later.** A ticket is required for Yom Kippur Afternoon and Yizkor (Memorial) Service. **Tickets are not transferable! If you will not be using your tickets, they cannot be given to non-members.**

INTERGENERATIONAL SERVICE – On Erev Rosh Hashanah and Erev Yom Kippur from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., there will be an Intergenerational Service in the Harry and Rose Samson Sanctuary. It is designed to appeal to the many generations of our congregation. As a reminder, tickets are not required for children of members under age 25 attending the service. This High Holy Days worship will be less formal in its music and liturgy, and allow for a more interactive experience.

CHILD/STUDENT INFORMATION – Tickets are not required for children under the age of 25. Children must be in 5th grade to attend the 8:00 p.m. Traditional Erev Rosh Hashanah and Erev Yom Kippur services and daytime services. All children are welcome to attend the Intergenerational Services at 6:00 p.m. in the Harry and Rose Samson Sanctuary, as well as the 2:15 p.m. Family Services on the first day of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Children’s High Holy Day programming is provided during the 8:45 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. daytime services for children not yet in 5th grade. **Please complete the Children’s High Holy Days Registration Form.**

GUEST TICKETS – If you would like to request a ticket for a guest to attend services, please complete the Ticket Application and return the form and your check to the office. Out of town guests who are members of an affiliated URJ Congregation should order tickets directly through their Synagogue to receive complimentary tickets. **The policy of the synagogue is that prospective members and local guests may purchase guest tickets as a one time courtesy.**

FAMILY SERVICE – At 2:15 p.m. on the first day of Rosh Hashanah and on Yom Kippur, there is a Family Service which is appropriate for families and children of all ages. **A ticket is required for the Family Service.**

TASHLICH SERVICE – This is another opportunity for parents and children to worship together. We meet at the home of Graig Goldman/Nancy LaKam (4857 N. Larkin St.); walk down to Lake Michigan at Big Bay Park; and “cast our sins” into the lake with the prayers chanted, read, and led by SHFTY. Returning to the Goldman/LaKam home, we share in the sweetness and fellowship of Rosh Hashanah with honey cake and conversation.

TRAVELING – If you will be traveling during the holidays, and want to attend services at another Synagogue, please contact the administrative office as soon as possible so that we can request reciprocal tickets for you.

PRAYER BOOKS – The Synagogue does not provide prayer books for the High Holy Days. You may purchase the prayer book, “Gates of Repentance” from the Administrative Office. For those attending the Intergenerational Service at 6:00 p.m. on Erev Rosh Hashanah and Erev Yom Kippur, a special prayerbook will be provided. Your burgundy “Gates of Repentance” will be used at the 8:00 p.m. Traditional Service and daytime services.

DECORUM – Please arrive on time as it is disturbing to other worshipers when you arrive late. Similarly, we ask that you not leave early. Under no circumstances should you move in or out of the sanctuary while the Congregation is standing out of respect for those key sections of the liturgy. Ushers are instructed to delay entry at these times. Please also remind your children/teens not to congregate in the hallway and to limit breaks. Also, we would like to remind you that on Yom Kippur it is not appropriate to leave following the Yizkor Service because the N’ilah (Concluding) Service will follow. **Please silence all cell phones.**

PARKING – Congregation Shalom’s parking lot holds no more than 180 cars. Please follow the directions of the parking attendants. Family and friends should try to car pool, if possible. On street parking will be allowed on both sides of the street but not along the median. Please do not block driveways, mail boxes, or fire hydrants. Parking behind the building in the alley or in the circular drive is prohibited by the Fox Point Police and Fire Department. Please observe the handicap parking spaces. Additional overflow parking is available at the Fox Point Lutheran Church, directly south of the Temple.

HANDICAPPED SEATING – Any family requiring special arrangements for handicapped seating or a wheelchair should contact the Temple office to make arrangements prior to the High Holy Days. Handicapped seating is reserved throughout the sanctuary. Those needing assistance entering the building may be dropped off at the circular drive entrance at the south end of the building.

SUKKOT & SIMCHAT TORAH – Sukkot & Simchat Torah observance are extremely meaningful and joyous. You may want to order a lulav (palm branch) and etrog (citron) for your personal home use. Please call Abby Habush Schroeder to order. Sukkot Services are followed by a visit to the beautiful congregation Sukkah. Simchat Torah Services are commemorated by reading Torah and dancing along with a Klezmer music band.

OFFICE CLOSING – The office will close at 12:00 p.m. on Erev Rosh Hashanah, Wednesday, September 28th. We will reopen on Monday, October 3rd at 9:00 a.m. The office will close at 12:00 p.m. on Erev Yom Kippur, Friday, October 7th. The office will be closed on Sukkot, Thursday, October 13th and on Simchat Torah, Thursday, October 20th.

MISCELLANEOUS – The quartet will play at both services for Kol Nidre.

BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

As in years past, we shall have a Book of Remembrance for the Memorial Service on Yom Kippur, listing the names of our departed loved ones. This booklet is also used throughout the year at other Memorial Services. According to Judaic tradition, "repentance, prayer and charity (Teshuvah, Tefilah, and Tzedakah) temper judgments severe decree." Through these mitzvot, Jews seek to re-establish their relationship with God and with other human beings and accomplish reconciliation with both. Therefore it is appropriate to give to charity before the High Holy Days to improve the spiritual and/or the material well-being of the community.

One way in which we may contribute to charity is by inscribing the name of your departed loved ones in Shalom's Memorial Book. **Contributions are voluntary and the amount is left to your discretion.**

In order to insure that all names submitted are correct and included in the booklet, it is necessary to begin the processing no later than **September 15, 2011**. No names will be read from the pulpit at the Memorial Service. Names received after **September 15, 2011** will not be included in the booklet. You can avoid disappointment by submitting the form below, **no later than September 15, 2011**.

Children's High Holy Day Program

Infant through 2 year-old and K-3 through 4th grade

During the morning services of Rosh Hashanah (1st day only) and Yom Kippur, Congregation Shalom offers special programs for our youngest members (Ages 0 – 9/10 or 4th grade) for a small fee. The program is supervised and conducted by the religious school staff, other paid adult staff, and our *madrichim* (student teacher assistants). Children in 5th grade and above are invited to join their parents for the main service, while children younger than this are encouraged to participate in the following programs.

*In order to maintain this program, we have had to institute a small charge for the sessions for the current year. Please contact us if financial issues are a concern for this program.

Infant through 2 year-old:

Babysitting is available for children not yet 3 years old during each morning service. Children are divided into classrooms according to their age and mobility. Typically there is an infant room and a toddler room.

K-3 through 4th grade:

A High Holy Day program, consisting of activities, projects, music, and religious services are provided for our pre-/school-aged children. Children are divided into classrooms according to their grade. While each class will have a slightly different program, the object is to give the children a sense of the holiness of the day and the joy of being Jewish.

Information on both programs:

1. Staff members are hired based on registration numbers. Please fill out the registration form and mail it in before September 12th. If you decide to cancel registration at any time, please let us know so that we may allow others to register if their registration is received after the deadline.
2. Children should be checked-in at the table in the school foyer between 8:20-8:40 a.m. (for the 8:45 a.m. service) and 11:10-11:30 a.m. (for the 11:30 a.m. service). Please enter **ONLY** through the front doors. Once children are checked-in, you will be directed to their assigned classroom to drop-off your children. You may pick them up from the assigned classroom as well.
3. On Rosh Hashanah, children will be given a snack during the program. On Yom Kippur, only children in kindergarten and younger will be offered a snack. If your child requires special food because of allergies or special needs, please bring the item, let us know, and clearly label the food item. Please make sure any food items are kosher style. Please do not bring any nuts or anything made with nuts.
4. Please label any personal items (including special toys) with the child's name. Diapers and any necessary supplies should be brought for babies and toddlers. We do not stock these items.
5. Once the children get adjusted to the program, it can be very disrupting when parents or siblings come to check on them. We ask for you to keep this in mind (even if it does not upset your child, it may have an effect on other children) and refrain from coming to "check-in". Please be assured, if there is a problem, we will come and get you from the sanctuary. If you have an infant who will need to be fed by you, please inform the staff in the room of the approximate time you will be there to feed the child.
6. Children who have a fever, diarrhea, or other contagious illnesses cannot be allowed to attend the program. Parents/Guardians of any children exhibiting symptoms will be asked to take their children home.
7. For security reasons, we will release a child only to the person who dropped him/her off or a pre-named authorized person.

There is a charge of \$10 per child/per session for these programs. Registration forms should be received by our office by Monday, September 12th. Late registrations are subject to sufficient staffing and will be charged \$20.00 per child/per session.
